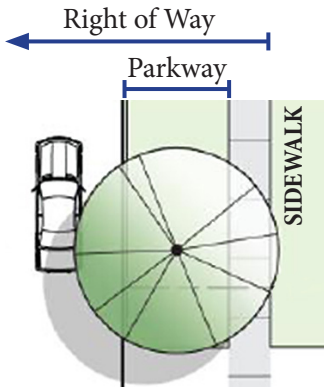

* Street trees are part of several Planned Developments designed before April 2011.

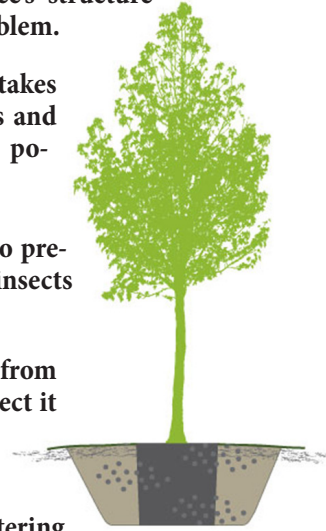
- Prune only when necessary to enhance the tree's structure or correct a problem.

- Remove above grade tree stakes to promote stronger roots and trunk while eliminating potential damage.

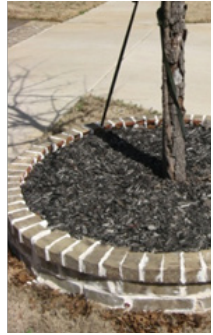
- Keep the root flare visible to prevent decay, disease and insects from entering the tree.

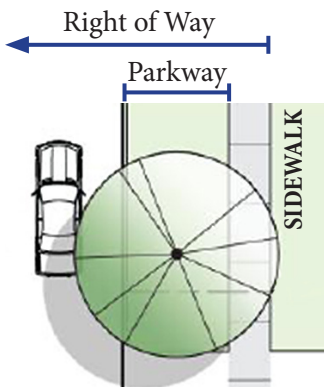

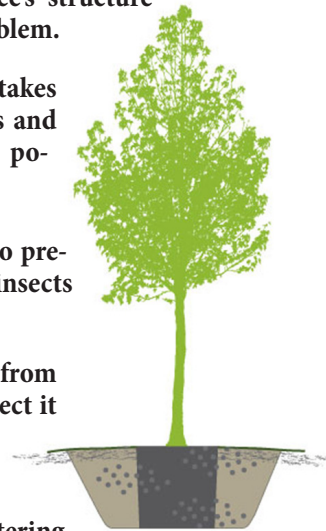

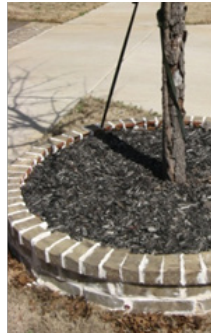
