



WALK 'N ROLL SAFETY

PEDESTRIAN SIGNALS

Walking and cycling is a healthy, fun way to get places. And remember, always check for on-coming traffic before you step into the crosswalk. Understanding what to do can keep you safe and help prevent injuries.

What do all the Symbols mean?

Following these simple steps will help you Walk 'n Roll safely in a crosswalk.



STEP 1: PUSH BUTTON
Push the button to alert the signal that a pedestrian is present. Wait for the pedestrian display to appear before crossing.



STEP 2: PEDESTRIAN DISPLAY
When you see the pedestrian display, step off the curb, stay in the crosswalk, and go directly across. Always look both ways and watch for turning vehicles before crossing.



STEP 3: FLASHING HAND DISPLAY
The flashing hand and countdown display will give sufficient time to finish crossing the street. If you have not started crossing, push the button, and WAIT for the next walk signal.



STEP 4: STEADY HAND DISPLAY
When the hand quits flashing, you should have finished crossing. Don't cross. Do not enter the roadway.

TRAFFIC SIGNS & SIGNALS FOR DRIVERS

Obeying traffic signs and signals will prevent injuries and keep our community safe.



School Zone speed in effect on school days during times posted on sign. Watch for school children. Use of wireless communication device is prohibited.



You are near a school. Slow down, watch for children, and prepare to stop for pedestrians.



Turning vehicles must yield to pedestrians.



Be prepared to stop ahead.



Come to a complete stop. Stop before the crosswalk, intersection, or stop sign.



Warns of a traffic signal ahead.



Slow down or stop if necessary to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians, bicycles, or vehicles.



The road ahead is for one-way traffic traveling in the opposite direction.



Turning right during a red light where this sign is posted is prohibited.




Steady Red Light
STOP! You must yield to all pedestrians and other traffic.



Steady Yellow Light
CAUTION! A steady yellow light warns drivers the light is about to change to red.



Steady Green Light
GO! You can proceed if it is safe to do so. Watch for cars and pedestrians in the intersection.



A Flashing Yellow Arrow For Left Turns
A flashing yellow arrow allows a driver to turn left. The driver must yield the right-of-way to oncoming traffic.
