Stay-at-home order

UPDATED MARCH 31, 2020

MARCH 27, 2020 – The City of Frisco is in two counties, Collin and Denton, and both counties amended emergency declarations on March 24 urging residents to **STAY AT HOME** unless they need “essentials” or are considered “essential” workers. The City of Frisco has applied Denton County’s definition of “essential” and amended its own ordinance on March 27 to be consistent with the state and county declarations. You may leave home

to go to work or do business at an “essential” business. City of Frisco parks and trails remain open for recreating (including biking, walking dogs), as long as you’re using social distancing of 6 feet.

- **Social distancing:** Must maintain at least 6 feet from any person when you’re outside your home. This means personal care businesses such as salons (nail, hair, tanning, waxing, spas) are non-essential due to social distancing order.
- **Restaurants and bars** may only provide take-out, delivery or drive-through service.
- **Religious and worship services** by video, teleconference, only.
- **No elective** medical, surgical or dental procedures.
- **No visitors** to nursing homes, retirement or long-term care facilities.
- **Use of public playground equipment is prohibited.** Basketball, volleyball and tennis courts are closed. Dash’s Track Disc Golf Course, Ruff Range Dog Park and the skate park at Northeast Community Park are also closed. - **Golf courses** are considered non-essential and must temporarily close.
- **No gatherings** of more than 10 people, per order by Governor Greg Abbott.

- Laundromats, dry cleaners and laundry service
- Auto and bike repair shops (no sales)

- Construction supply stores
- Hardware stores
- Pet supply stores
- Businesses supplying products needed to work from home

DISADVANTAGED POPULATIONS

- Nonprofits providing food, shelter and social services

HOME AND BUSINESS OPERATIONS

- Trash, recycling and disposal services
- Mail and shipping
- Cleaning, landscaping and home maintenance, and security services
- Storage
- Funeral homes
- Plumbers, electricians, exterminators
- Legal services
- Accounting
- Property management, real estate services

GOVERNMENT: All services provided by governments needed to ensure the continuing operation of the government agencies to provide for the health, safety and welfare of the public.

MEDIA: Newspapers, television, radio and other media services

CHILDCARE: Facilities providing services that allow “essential” employees to work

DELIVERY HOUR RESTRICTIONS

SUSPENDED: Due to demand for groceries, hospitals and medical facilities delivery hour restrictions are suspended 60 days.

Voluntary compliance is our goal. Otherwise, violators may face misdemeanor charges.
