EXPEDITED PERMITTING PROCESS FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

The City wants to assist you in reopening your food establishment as quickly as possible, if not already open on a limited-service basis. ***If your permit has not expired, and none of the conditions below apply, you may reopen with no additional inspections or permitting once restrictions are lifted.***

If your food establishment permit ***has expired*** while you have been closed or operating on a limited-service basis, you do not have to wait to renew. You may apply for your renewal now so you will be ready to go when the restrictions are lifted.

A permit or pre-approval may be required under the following circumstances:

- ◆ Menu additions/changes to food type or equipment;
(A permit or inspection is not required for limiting or removing menu items)
- ◆ Changes to floor plan or to fixture plan;
(A permit or inspection is not required where tables or chairs are moved/removed or where social distancing measures are placed such as line queuing, so long as the actions do not block fire exiting)
- ◆ Name or ownership changes.

If your food establishment permit has expired or will expire soon, you must renew your permit before reopening. Expiration date can be found on your permit placard or you may call us at the number below. The three-step non-contact application process is as follows:

1. Complete the food establishment permit application at the following link: <https://www.friscotexas.gov/DocumentCenter/View/82/Food-Establishment-Health-Permit-Application-PDF> and submit the application to us via email at health@friscotexas.gov.
2. Within one business day an email will be sent with instructions on how to submit payment through our new online portal: <https://etrakit.friscotexas.gov/etrakit/>. Be sure to have your permit number ready. ***If payment cannot be made at this time, due to the extraordinary circumstances, late fees will not be assessed; however, all permit fees must be paid no later than December 31, 2020.***
3. An updated food establishment permit placard will be emailed to you.
