Open Frisco at a glance

UPDATED JUNE 4, 2020

On June 2, the Frisco City Council amended its emergency ordinance to align with Governor Greg Abbott's revised Executive Order and **The Governor's Report to 'Open Texas'**. All essential businesses remain open under the operating guidelines previously provided by the **Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM)** and the **U.S. Department of Homeland Security**. Effective June 3 50% capacity

- **Businesses may operate at 50% capacity (increased from 25%) and includes:**
 - **Bars** – Patrons must be seated
- **Restaurants**
 - Table seating increases from 6 to 10
 - Capacity increases to 75% on June 12

NEW

- **Amusement parks** — 50% capacity beginning June 19
- **Performance halls**
- **Outdoor events (500+)**
 - Mayor (or County Judge), in conjunction with health authorities, may impose additional restrictions
- **Valet parking**
- **Video game facilities**

REVISED

- **Bowling alleys**
- **Driving schools**
- **Gyms**
- **Manufacturers**
- **Movie theaters**
- **Museums and libraries**
- **Professional, collegiate or similar sports leagues**
- **Retailers**
- **Swimming pools**
- **Water parks**
- **Wedding receptions and venues**

No occupancy limit*

- * **May not exceed City of Frisco permitted occupancy**
- * **Must maintain 6 feet social distancing**
- **Barber Shops**
- **Child-care services**
- **Churches and places of worship**
- **Cosmetology / Hair salons**
- **Essential businesses** (defined by U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security's Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), version 3.1)
- **Government operations**, including municipal and county
- **Massage, personal care**
- **Recreational sports programs for youth and adults**
 - **Youth**
 - **Adults**
- **Youth camps – includes summer, daytime and overnight**
 - **Summer**
 - **Daytime**
 - **Overnight**

The following businesses, facilities and services are NOT OPEN or allowed at this time:

- **City of Frisco water parks**
- **No visitors to nursing homes, assisted living or long-term care facilities.**

Use a new **City of Frisco tool to calculate your business capacity**. The tool will show your approved maximum occupancy and calculate your capacity. You'll find a color-coded column signaling whether you can 'open' under Phases I or II of the **Open Texas plan**.
