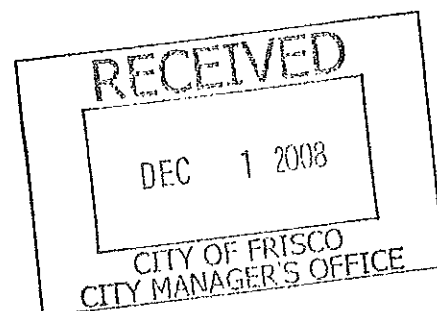

To the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality:

This law firm represents the City of Frisco ("City"). The City is in receipt of the notification of the above-referenced application. The City has had a very good long term relationship with Exide Technologies ("Exide") and Exide has been a good corporate citizen. The City is concerned that the requested permit amendment will authorize lead emissions in excess of the actual current level at Exide's Frisco facility. The City and Exide are in the process of attempting to resolve the City's concern. However, it will not be possible to resolve the issue prior to the expiration of the public comment period reflected in the above notice. 
